SUBJECT: Letter to the Governor of the Virgin Islands

Attached is a letter to Governor Juan Luis of the Virgin Islands acknowledging receipt of the territory's proposed constitution which was accepted on your behalf by the Vice President. The draft was written subsequent to your call for a locally-authored document to replace the Federal law which now organizes the territory and is to be submitted to the Congress with your recommendations for action.

The letter has been cleared by the speechwriters and we recommend that you sign it.



Vice President Mondale has given me the proposed Constitution of the Virgin Islands which you transmitted to him August 26, in accordance with Public Law 94-584.

As the Vice President indicated, the Administration will review the draft promptly so that it can be submitted to the Congress with our recommendations for action at the earliest possible time. My Domestic Policy Staff is already consulting with appropriate agencies on the issues involved. We will stay in touch with you as this process continues.

Let me express my appreciation through you to all those involved in the development of this draft. It responds to my call of February 14 for the people of the territory to take part in the constitution-writing process so that a locally-determined document can replace the Federal statute that now organizes the territorial government. Only by facing up to the hard decisions inherent in this process can Virgin Islanders attain our common goal of full internal self-government.

As you know, we have been working with Senator Moynihan to devise both a political and legislative strategy for dealing with the Proxmire amendment to the HUD Appropriations Bill. We cannot win on an up-or-down vote on this amendment in the Senate. We need Senator Byrd's active help in (1) avoiding a roll call vote on the Proxmire amendment, (2) avoiding any instructions to the Senate conferees regarding this amendment, and (3) softening the position of those who will represent the Senate conference. We recommend that you call Senator Byrd and ask for his help in all three of these aspects.

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TALKING POINTS

1. The full Appropriations Committee has adopted by voice vote Senator Proxmire's amendment to the HUD Appropriations Bill which hamstring's the Treasury Department's ability to administer the New York City loan guarantee program.
2. This puts my Administration in a very difficult situation as far as New York is concerned. I need your help to avoid these difficulties on the HUD Appropriations Bill.
3. If Senator Proxmire and his allies seek to confirm the Appropriations Committee language, or to instruct the Senate conferees through roll call votes, they will almost certainly succeed. It would put me in an embarrassing position, but it would also put several other Senate democrats who are up for reelection in an awkward position as well. I need your help.



SUBJECT: Federal Supplemental Benefits (FSB)

As you requested we have taken another look at possible options for including more high unemployment states and communities in a supplemental unemployment benefits program. We considered a number of proposals, taking into account cost, coverage, and legislative feasibility, and recommend that you consider a single alternative to the program you approved on September 10.\* All of your advisors, the AFL-CIO and the UAW have been consulted and have registered their views on the proposals.

In your August 28 announcement you stated you were asking Congress to provide 13 additional weeks of unemployment compensation in high unemployment states. The cost of that program was announced as \$744 million.

On Wednesday you approved a targeted FSB program that would be effective October 1, 1980 and terminate December 31, 1981. The cost would range between \$600 million and \$1.3 billion, depending upon future unemployment rates. Approximately 12 states would begin paying the additional benefits between now and the end of the year.

As an alternative, if you wish to use it, we have evaluated a six-month National FSB program that would go into effect October 1 and end on March 31. Benefits would be paid in all 50 states and the program would cost between \$1.5 and \$1.8 billion. This program would supplement for six months the current national and state extended benefits (EB) program (which provides an additional 13 weeks of benefits up to a maximum of 39 weeks). The current EB program came into effect in all states in late July when the national trigger was met, and should remain throughout calendar year '81.

\* This review included examination of a program targeted on high unemployment communities. Such a program is not possible because of several major technical and program problems.

The specific features of the two programs and the advantages and disadvantages of each are discussed below:

### Targeted FSB

#### o Features

- national threshold of 4.5 percent insured unemployment (IUR) that must be met before eligible states can pay benefits
- state trigger of 5.5 percent insured unemployment
- the same number of weeks of benefits as under the EB program--up to a maximum of 13 weeks. Thus, an individual would receive up to a total of 52 weeks of benefits
- requirement that recipients must have worked 32 weeks in a base period to target benefits to individuals with a strong attachment to the labor force
- benefits paid in 12 states between now and January to about half of the 443,000 individuals who will exhaust their regular and extended coverage
- financed from general revenues, at a cost of \$600 million to \$1.3 billion
- termination of program on December 31, 1981

#### o Advantages

- program is highly targeted in directing benefits to states with the highest insured unemployment and to workers with the longest work histories
- excludes extended benefit recipients in calculating trigger rates, which has the effect of ending the program sooner
- program preserves some room for negotiating with the Congress both on economic assumptions and costs
- with moderate good luck on the economic assumptions (e.g., halfway between the low and the high unemployment projection) it adds only slightly to the \$744 million in outlays we have already announced as the cost of this program

o Disadvantages

- the program is not likely to pay any benefits in such key Northeast and Midwest states as New York, New Jersey, Massachusetts, Indiana and Illinois this year
- because the program is based on the insured unemployment rate it will not trigger on in a number of states where the total unemployment rate is as high or higher as in those states which would participate. For example, in August, New York had a total unemployment rate of 7.9% but an insured rate of only 3.8%. Under this targeted program, New York would be excluded while other states with lower total unemployment are likely to pay benefits
- the AFL-CIO will oppose excluding extended benefit recipients in calculating the national and state triggers. Judge Oberdorfer recently overturned our attempt to implement this change by regulation for the extended benefits program. If the unions win this dispute on the Hill, the program would become much more expensive
- Congress is likely to expand the proposal since it doesn't include enough states to get a majority in either the House or Senate

Six-Month National FSB

o Features

- a national trigger of 4.5 percent with extended benefit recipients included in the calculation
- the same number of weeks of additional benefits as under the EB program--up to a maximum of 13 weeks. Thus an individual would receive up to a total of 52 weeks of benefits
- benefits paid in all states to 100% (approximately 443,000 persons) of those who will exhaust their regular and extended benefits
- a weeks of work requirement as determined for a state's basic unemployment insurance program

- financing from general revenues, at cost of \$1.5 to \$1.8 billion
- termination of program on March 31, 1981

o Advantages

- the program would pay benefits in all 50 states between now and April '81
- it should be easier to enact because it adopts the familiar features and provisions of the regular extended benefits program. A similar program was adopted by Congress in March 1977 at the end of the last recession and was in effect through January 1978
- the 6 month termination date does not lock us into an entire year and gives us time to develop a program for the balance of 1981 and beyond as part of the budget process this fall and based on the official economic forecast released in January
- the unions prefer this alternative but want a program with more than a 6 month duration

o Disadvantages

- the proposal may be criticized because it is twice as expensive for half as long as the program announced on August 28th and does not focus just on high unemployment states, but provides short-term coverage everywhere--you will be seen as substantially busting your budget within only three weeks of announcing your economic program, and this perception could add its bit to the upcreep in interest rates. However, the high unemployment estimate for the targeted program presents the same problem
- those concerned about the composition of the new Congress may exert pressure to legislate for more than 6 months, making this option more expensive. If unemployment is higher it may be difficult to introduce a more targeted program next year
- this option does not include the program changes (32 weeks of work, excluding EB recipients in calculating the triggers) proposed in the targeted program

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Decision

1. Hold to September 10th proposal for a Targeted FSB program.

Comments

Eizenstat notes that DPS originally supported a targeted program with a 5% state trigger, which would have cost between \$816 million and \$1.6 billion and included 7 additional states; however, he defers to Pat Caddell's judgement about the value of that option compared to the political value of the six-month National FSB program.

Maybank Amendment to the Defense Appropriations  
Bill

This memorandum responds to your request that we advise you on Congressman Bob Edgar's memorandum on the Maybank amendment to the Defense Appropriations bill.

Background

As part of your urban policy, you issued an Executive Order strengthening the Federal government's efforts to target procurement to high unemployment areas. While the amount of procurement involved is still small, this effort has been reasonably successful in the civilian procurement agencies. We have more than doubled procurement set-asides in high unemployment areas (from approximately \$250 million in FY 1979, to approximately \$500 million in FY 1980), and have set a much larger goal for FY 1981 (\$1.2 billion).

The Maybank amendment to the Defense -- the government's largest procurement agency -- Appropriations bill effectively precludes the Department of Defense from participating in the procurement set-aside program. It prohibits DOD from paying a higher price for goods and services procured in high unemployment areas. As a result, the only way DOD can target its procurement is by letting split contracts -- half of the contract to set the lowest price, and the other half of the contract set aside for firms in high unemployment areas. This cumbersome process is hardly ever used.

Last year Congressman Joe Addabbo (Chairman of the Defense Appropriations Subcommittee) offered an amendment that would have repealed the Maybank amendment completely. That amendment was the top legislative priority of the Northeast-Midwest Congressional Coalition. It was defeated by 13 votes on the House floor (187-174).

Congressman Addabbo intends to offer a more limited amendment this year. His amendment would repeal the Maybank amendment only for DOD procurement that is unrelated to national security (i.e., office equipment, textiles, food, etc.). The amendment will be considered by the House next week, probably on Wednesday. Congressman Edgar's memorandum asks that you send a letter supporting the Addabbo amendment.

In the past, DOD has strongly opposed repealing the Maybank amendment. They feel it will increase defense procurement costs and inject socio-economic considerations into defense policy. DOD has not yet taken a position on Addabbo's limited repeal of Maybank, but we expect that they will be strongly opposed.

This issue is extremely important in the Northeast and Midwest. Representatives of these regions feel very strongly that the repeal of Maybank would be a major step toward redressing what they perceive to be an imbalance in Federal spending (particularly defense spending) in their region. Given the limitations on Federal spending that have been imposed, they feel it is essential that we use existing resources, such as procurement, to generate more jobs in the lagging regions of the country. There is no question that Administration support of the Addabbo amendment will provide tremendous political benefit to you in these regions (Reagan endorsed a similar concept earlier this week in Cleveland).

Substantively, the Addabbo amendment provides a good vehicle for providing more jobs in the lagging regions of the country without increasing the budget. It is consistent with your view, articulated in your urban policy, that Federal resources and jobs should be targeted to the areas of greatest need. Moreover, in its revised form its effect on DOD activities is reduced and its prospects for passage enhanced. We would recommend that you support the Addabbo amendment.

Decision:
