

Exit Interview with Nancy Ellen Gold

In early September 1978, Nancy Gold called Marie Allen of the Presidential Papers Staff in response to the suggestion of the Personnel Office. Nancy was halfway through her last day on the job and was not able to come to the Presidential Papers Office for an interview. The information below was therefore communicated by telephone.

Nancy worked as a mail analyst under the supervision of Bud Quigley and Lillie Bell in the Presidential Correspondence office. Nancy first worked at the White House during three college summer vacations, and then began full-time employment in December 1977. She helped out occasionally in the Comment Office or Mailroom but spent most of her time reading mail to the President from adults and children and deciding on an appropriate disposition. She could assign a form reply number to the letter or recommend referral to an agency, staff member, or the Special Reply Unit. Nancy couldn't remember any particularly noteworthy letters. She is leaving to work as a contract specialist at the Navy Department.
