Carter Library Hosts Historian, South Africans and Ambassador International Affairs Topic of Three Lectures

Atlanta, GA. - Three fascinating talks are on tap at the Jimmy Carter Presidential Library and Museum.

On Monday, July 17th, Robert Rosen, author of "Saving the Jews: Franklin D. Roosevelt and the Holocaust", will discuss whether FDR was an indifferent or possibly anti-Semitic president who abandoned European Jews, or was he a pragmatic leader who understood that the key to saving the Jews was winning WWII as swiftly as possible?

On Wednesday, July 19th, two of Archbishop Desmond Tutu's daughters will be interviewed by Monica Kaufman. The Tutu sisters will talk about what it was like growing up with a politically activist father, as well as the changes in South Africa as the country shifted from Apartheid to Democracy. "Creatively Speaking, A Conversation with the Tutu Sisters" is in conjunction with the National Black Arts Festival.

On Wednesday, August 2nd, Ambassador Peter Galbraith will read from his new book, "The End of Iraq". Publishers Weekly says Galbraith "presents a clear-eyed and persuasive case against the Bush administration's nation-building project (in Iraq) ".
